IV. Deliberation Session (brainstorming/open forum)

- Men's Campout in September 7-9, 2007, only 150 spots available. Going fast.
- Vice Chair of ARANA Softball Tourney, August 11. Starts at 8am. Need scorekeepers, folks to help with food and other stuff. Rusch Park, Antelope and East 80. Go to SacramentoNA.org website for more information.
- RE: Support. It's the responsibility of each group to stand on its own feet. Groups should take care of themselves. Groups shouldn't advertise for treasures and GSRs at Area level.
- RE: H&I can: Concept 11 addresses the issue of donating to subcommittees.
- RE: Support: Moving the location of a meeting may be all that is needed to resolve an attendance issue.

- RE: Support: Support is about getting people to do whatever is necessary to get the meeting to happen. Setting up, if you continuously have to go outside the group to get warm bodies to hold the meeting together the quality of the message will suffer.
- This building is being torn down in 2008. Our group uses this building and is grateful to be here.

V. Decision Session

Proposal 1: To adopt guidelines and procedures for activities hosted by groups and coordinated in cooperation with SacFNA-ASC.

- The single point of accountability is a group.
- It would be a good idea to put a committee together to plan these events.
- Why are we entertaining the idea of groups putting on events when we have a service structure that calls for subcommittees that allow groups to do recovery meetings and subcommittees to take care of the activities?
- We need to think about the services we want to give and the best way to give those services. Whether they are standing services or they are flexible with people floating in to serve at different times.
- Go to Regional assembly and they will be talking about that.
- Group is concerned about taking away from primary purpose. Think it is Area's responsibility.
- Concern about the money. Concern about ASC motives. Meetings should provide own funding and be self-sufficient without ASC funds.
- This is no different than the broader group doing an annual picnic. We're only providing a way for groups to come to Area to ask for money.
- What happened to the lists of people volunteering to be of service? Many have been collected.
- How do we form an event committee? Propose an event and a coordinator.
- Would we post activities on our Website? Yes.
- Example: Circle of Sisters, independent group. Held in an Area and supported by Region and Area.

Consensus was not gained on this proposal. Proposal was put off for one month.

Proposal 2: To buy a coffee pot and identify a coffee person and place a donation cup by the coffee table. We will buy the coffee pot for \$100.

Many thumbs up for the coffee pot. ASC would buy coffee cups, cream sugar, cups, etc. Have a basket by the coffee pot to help fund the cost..

- Not a prudent use of our money. Will our 7th tradition go towards purchase of coffee and supplies?
- Good idea because it will provide a welcoming feeling.
- How much will it cost (estimate)?

Proposal accepted and David volunteers as the coffee person.

Proposals from the floor:

Proposal 3: To discontinue collecting money for ARANA H&I at SacFNA ASC

Opposition: ASC is responsible to handle funds for meetings.

Support: ASC supports subcommittees and cans micro-manage NA subcommittee funding.

Much discussion about the merits/lack thereof passing the H&I can in meetings without resolution of the proposal itself.

Proposal does not gain consensus.
