## V. Decision Session

**Proposal 1:** To accept and adopt the guidelines as amended

Concerned about approving guidelines in 10 minutes. Can we move this to old business next month?

We can't get the guidelines resolved tonight but are there more concerns than the two brought up last month to register in general?

Please review the proposed amended guidelines before next month

**Proposal 2:** To give Carlos and Bob authority to plan an activity for November 10 on behalf of the Area with a budget of \$400.

**Sat, Nov 10<sup>th</sup>, Trinity Cathedral, 5:00p, Spaghetti Feed, 6:30p Speaker Meeting, \$6.00 meal**

- Flier is great idea for people to contact Carlos to get tickets
- Concerned about doing an event without a budget
- Can print tickets in books of ten so many people can sell
- Need to start at 5pm in order to end by 9
- We should ask groups about their interest and get a sense of how many people will attend
  - Last month we proposed/accepted the idea of having an activity
- Speaker after we eat? Yes
- Like the proposal but where will the money come from? Let's allocate funds for this event. At the next meeting, Carlos can bring a budget breakdown. Maybe \$300-400 total costs. Probably need to sell 60 tickets to break even.
- Can we establish a budget of \$400 to fund this event?
  - Proposal amended to include \$400 budget.
- What's the rush? Do we need to have this in November?
  - This Area doesn't even have a budget.
  - But we can still have a fundraiser.
  - Check the occupancy of the room.
  - This is a fundraiser for our Area (we need a prudent reserve, H&I subcommittee)

Call for consensus: Broad consensus. One concerned member upheld consensus.

**Proposal 3:** To move forward on PR priorities by assigning responsibility for overall coordination to the ASC Vice Chair and identifying coordinators for the top 3 (or more) tasks through a meeting to be set in October.

- Need volunteers next month to take on the tasks, specific to their choice (one of our top three tasks) or work together on multiple tasks.
- Now is the time to call on the people who volunteered to be of service earlier this year.
- Let's redistribute the volunteer sign up sheets this month and bring name, numbers, email addresses back to Eric at October ASC. Or GSRs can give Eric's name and phone number.

- Eric will put together a list of the three activities with contact information and post on website.

Clarification: ASC Vice Chair is the likely point person to help coordinate the whole PR effort.  
Clarification: Vice Chair will find a place to meet and announce at following ASC. Will set up the groundwork around the various efforts.

Clarification: What is the process for utilizing the volunteer lists? Eric will call/email the folks once he's identified a meeting place/time (probably in October).
